Ordinance No. 849-14

Passed MAY 19, 2014

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE NUMBER 253-59;
AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF
TONTOGANY, WOOD COUNTY, OHIO:

Section 1. That Ordinance Number 253-59, entitled AN ORDINANCE
TO LICENSE PEDDLERS, SOLICITORS, OR CANVASSERS, OR
ITINERANT MERCHANTS IN THE VILLAGE OF TONTOGANY, OHIO, is
hereby repealed.

Section 2. That this Ordinance constitutes an emergency measure
necessary for the immediate welfare and safety of the citizens of Tontogany
due to the need to eliminate multiple regulations for the control of the same
activities and situations, and therefore, shall go into immediate effect upon
passage.

ORDINANCE No. 253-59

An Ordinance to License Peddlers, Solicitors, or Canvassers, or Itinerant Merchants in the Village of Tontogany, Ohio.

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Tontogany, Ohio as follows:

Sec. I. That it shall be unlawful for any peddler, solicitor, or canvasser, or for any itinerant merchant to solicit sales of, to sell, to offer for sale, to barter, or to exchange goods, wares, or personal services without first obtaining from an authorized Village Official a license to do so.

Sec. II. That the requirements of a license provided in Sec. I shall not apply to any person who shall offer for sale or exchange produce of his own raising, or to a duly authorized solicitor soliciting the purchasing of goods or wares for or on behalf of any recognized educational, civic, religious, or charitable organization.

Sec. III. That licenses for peddlers, solicitors, and itinerant merchants shall be obtained without charge from the Village. The applicant shall fill out the application giving his name, home address, name and address of the person by whom employed, length of service with such employer, the nature and character of the goods to be sold or services to be furnished by the applicant, names of other towns in which the applicant has recently conducted a business for which licenses are herein required, and a personal description of the applicant.

Sec. IV. That each license issued shall expire on the 31st. day of December in the year in which the permit shall have been issued.

Sec. V. Any applicant who has applied for a license in accordance with this Ordinance, and has been denied a license, shall be entitled to appeal to the Council. Notice of such appeal shall be filed with the Clerk of Council within five days after the denial of the license. The Council, on appeal, may grant or reject the application for license.

Sec. VI. The permit shall be exhibited in the place of business by itinerant merchants and shall be carried by any peddler or solicitor at all times when peddling or soliciting and shall be exhibited to any person solicited or any police officer on request.

Sec. VII. Any person who violates this Ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and fined not more than \$50.00 for each offense. Each days continued violation shall be a separate offense.

Sec. VIII. All Ordinances or parts thereof repugnant to the foregoing shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Sec. IX. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
