

ORDINANCE NO. 922-20

VILLAGE OF TONTOGANY, WOOD COUNTY, OHIO

ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A FOUR-WAY STOP SIGN AT THE INTERSECTION OF
BROAD STREET AND MAIN STREET

WHEREAS, the Village of Tontogany is a Statutory Village located in Wood County, Ohio, and

WHEREAS, the Village has powers of local self-government, including the power to establish streets and street signs located in the Village, and

WHEREAS, within the Village, Broad Street intersects with Main Street. That intersection now contains a mandatory two-way stop, and

WHEREAS, the Village now desires to establish a mandatory four-way stop at said intersection.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Tontogany, Ohio, that:

1. The intersection of Broad Street and Main Street is hereby declared to require a mandatory four-way stop of the traveling public.
2. The Village Streets Department is hereby directed to take all reasonable measures to ensure the traveling public is made aware of this change, including, but not limited to, the purchase and the erection of new stop signs compliant with the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Devices that include a directive that the intersection is a four-way mandatory stop, and to take any other measures reasonably believed to be necessary to lessen the risk of injury as a result of this change.
3. The Village Fiscal Officer is hereby directed to publish notice of this Ordinance as required by law.
4. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any other committees that results in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

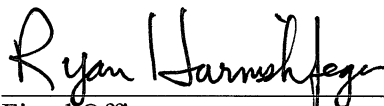
